God, Jesus and the Spirit

On Pentecost Sunday this month we will celebrate what traditionally is known as the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Those of us who travel in the world of spiritual pilgrimage tend to navigate such waters as God-centric, Christ-centric or Spirit-centric. Often we make these choices subconsciously.

A God-centric pilgrim thinks about God, prays to God, wonders about God, lives for God. These of course can be right and good things to do. They can also be problematic depending upon one's concept of God.

A Christ-centric pilgrim thinks about Jesus Christ, prays to Jesus Christ, wonders about Jesus Christ, lives for Jesus Christ. These ask the question What would Jesus do? Trust Jesus, follow Jesus, give it all to Christ, John 3:16. These of course can also be right and good things to do.

Thirdly the Spirit-centric pilgrim thinks about the Holy Spirit, prays to the Holy Spirit, wonders about the Holy Spirit, lives for the Holy Spirit. Genesis 2 records God creating humanity from the muddy ground and then giving humanity life by breathing ruah – spirit into it. John 3:8 says that the pneuma – spirit blows where it wills and we hear the sound of it – but we do not know where it comes from and where it goes – so it is for the people of the pneuma – spirit.

Like Luther I will now make my stand — I am primarily Spirit-centric, the life and message of the Christ informs my understanding of the Spirit, and God is Wholly Other. Most of my praying is done with my eyes open. I ask the Spirit to reveal itself to me and if nobody is around I talk to it out loud.

On my good days this is a right and good thing for me to do. Those days I feel like a train on a track. I have never heard with my ears the Spirit talking back to me and if I ever do I don't think I would be able to handle it.

What about you? God, Jesus or the Spirit?

SEARCH COMMITTEE UPDATE



The Knox Learning Center School Garden is Growing!

The Learning Center now has three raised garden beds on their playground! We have planted strawberries, peas, radishes, lettuce, carrots, spinach, kale, basil and sunflowers. Thanks to a *Youth Garden Award*, the school garden program added two indoor grow towers in February to start plants for the outdoor beds.



We are working with both K-3 and 4-5 grade classrooms this year in addition to a group of young adults with developmental disabilities in the *Transition-U* program at the Learning Center. This program has offered many cross-curricular learning opportunities for students, including learning about nutrition and trying new foods. We have germinated seeds in the classroom and thanks to a gift from the Mission and Service team at FCUCC, and introduced red wiggler worms to a composting worm bin on Earth Day. Students will be charting their food and water intake and feeding the worms lunch scraps. One student made the comment this week; "You know, I love worms!"




The gift from our First Congregational friends will also allow us to create garden banners for our new outdoor garden area. The garden signs will incorporate some of the students artwork.
